There are entries on Dreamworks' *Shrek*, Pixar's *Toy Story*, and Disney's *The Jungle Book*, but you will also find pieces on Germany's silhouette-based *The Adventures of Prince Achmed*, the oldest surviving animated feature; on the thirty year production of Richard Williams' legendary opus, *The Thief and the Cobbler*; and on the lost work of Argentina's Quirino Cristiani, who reputedly made the first animated feature in 1917.
